What will Title I do for my child?

Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act provides financial assistance to state and local educational agencies to meet the needs of educationally deprived, at-risk children. The goal of Title I is to provide instructional services and activities to meet the needs of disadvantaged children identified as failing or at risk of failing the state's performance standards

Title I Schools:

Identify students who need the most educational assistance. Students do NOT have to be from low-income families to receive Title I services

Champion Schools runs a School-wide Title I program for all students in grades K-8. Services are available during school hours (without conflicting with the regular class day), as well as offered before or after school in Reading and Math.
